A NEW AMBITION FOR AGEING RESEARCH

The Barriers:

- Society: the structural lag
- Science: overemphasis on disciplines, separation from users, inadequate knowledge transfer
- Policy: fragmentation of departments/approaches, inadequate funding for research on ageing
- European Union: the healthy life years gap, absence of permanent scientific coordination.






